INGEO'S FAST-PACED GROWTH POINTS TO SOUND PRODUCTS / SOLID PERFORMANCE

In the first six months of 2009 Ingeo recorded one-third of the total transactions processed by the company in its 13-year history. "By the end of the year, this number will jump to one-half of all our transactions," commented Karl Klessig, Ingeo's CEO.

Klessig attributes Ingeo's incremental growth to the company's continuing improvement program. "We've built a solid infrastructure that consistently delivers documents with speed, accuracy and security," Klessig said. "Our growing submitter list and unparalleled county network attest to the quality of Ingeo's performance and our customer satisfaction."

Ingeo's customers praise the company's low error rates, simplified payment process and streamlined new products. Last year, Ingeo launched two new products. Ingeo iPrepare™ is an automated, online activation process for electronic document preparation. Ingeo iTax™ processes transfer tax documents and enables e-recording of related deeds. This year the company is introducing Ingeo iRecord™, a web application that provides electronic recording to all counties, regardless of their size or integration status.

"At Ingeo we've created a new environment for e-recording," Klessig said. "We're taking testing and validation to the next level and working to simplify the processes of handling L2 and L3 documents." Ingeo also has added staff to handle all the new capabilities and customers. "We're building an incredibly successful company focused on serving our submitters, counties and partners at the highest levels of excellence," Klessig said.

NEW PRODUCT, INGIO IRECORD, OFFERS E-RECORDING TO ALL COUNTIES

Ingeo recently developed its newest product offering, Ingeo iRecord™, a web application that provides electronic recording to nonintegrated and smaller counties.

"With Ingeo iRecord, County Recorders that have no Land Records Management System (LRMS), are not ready to have electronic delivery integrated with their systems, or have only filing capability now can enjoy the speed, efficiency and cost savings of electronic delivery of documents and payments through Ingeo's Electronic Document Recording System," said Karl Klessig, Ingeo's CEO.

With this new capability, County Recorders can visit Ingeo's website (www.ingeo.com), view details about the new offering, sign up online, and get connected with Ingeo's iRecord guide who will walk them through the steps of setting up their configuration requirements.

Ingeo iRecord has been designed so it can operate in two modes. One is for nonintegrated counties, where the county is responsible for entering all the recordation information. The other is for counties that use a LRMS, which automatically provides this recordation information. Both options provide counties with fast, accurate and efficient electronic document delivery and return that saves both time and money.

"This new capability requires no system integration," Klessig explained. "All the information, such as contacts, types of documents and template requirements is input through the interface."

INGEO iTAX REET INTRODUCES NEW E-RECORDING PRODUCT TO WASHINGTON

Ingeo iTax™ REET, a new web service capability, allows counties to process Real Estate Excise Tax (REET) affidavit data electronically, saving time and costs while increasing security and efficiency. Ingeo's initial launch of this new product version is in Washington State with plans to expand next into Ohio and then other states in the company's nationwide network.



“With Ingeo iTax REET, counties can submit REET Data electronically to the Department of Revenue with an online single affidavit submission, a bulk file upload or through Ingeo's REET web service,” said Karl Klessig, Ingeo's CEO. “We've created a new business environment that reduces manual processing time of REET data, improves the REET audit process and enhances customer service.”

Ingeo's initial launch of iTax was last fall in Milwaukee County, Wisconsin. Currently, six counties in that state are using Ingeo iTax to process the transfer tax with the deed. With Ingeo iTax, County Recorders process tax documents and payments in conjunction with the electronic recording of mortgages. “Wisconsin is the first state to come aboard with Ingeo iTax and Florida, Missouri and Colorado will soon follow,” Klessig said. “Now we have adapted the product to meet the requirements for REET affidavits in Washington State and we're getting good feedback from counties and assessor's offices in other states to continue our expansion.”

INGEO BOOSTS POPULATION COVERAGE TO MORE THAN 50% IN TEN STATES

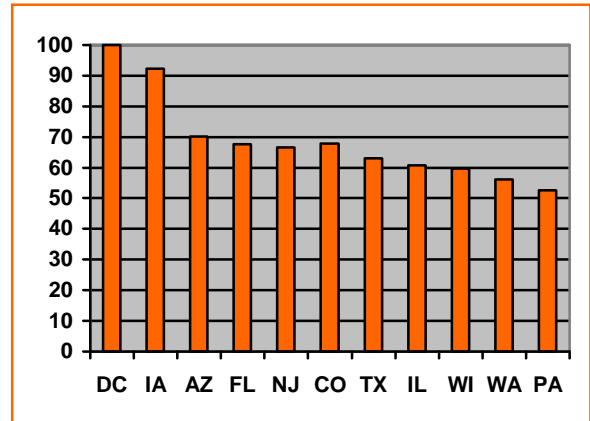
As Ingeo continues its fast pace to add more and more counties to its nationwide network, it increases the opportunity for people to enjoy the speed, accuracy and security of electronic document recording. At the close of the second quarter of 2009, Ingeo listed ten states where its population coverage was more than 50 percent. Overall the average coverage in Ingeo's 27 network states is 42 percent and that number will grow to 47 percent by year-end allowing Ingeo submitters to submit more documents electronically.

“With our expanded reach across the country, Ingeo is bringing the benefits of electronic document recording not only to counties and County Recorders but also to the constituents they serve,” said Karl Klessig, Ingeo's CEO. “Ingeo's system offers tremendous savings in time and costs, while increasing security and reducing error rates.”
